

## 'PRINCIPLES AND ETHICS OF RESEARCH PROJECTS'



The second lecture of the Q-rius series was inaugurated by Dr. Tejashree Shanbhag, Vice Principal, K.C. College. In her welcome address, Dr. Shanbhag emphasized on the significance of engaging in research during undergraduate studies and also ensured the students that they will understand and learn about various important aspects of research from this session. Dr. Bharat Bhushan Sharma commenced the session by briefly elucidating the importance of research especially at the undergraduate level. Sir elaborated that undertaking a research project not only creates a progressive change in the student's learning style but also constructively contributes to their personal, scientific and professional maturity. Sir advised the students that it is essential to select a research topic which is of their interest and beneficial to society. Sir then concisely explained the different types of research projects and also recommended a book to the students for data analysis and bioinformatics.

Furthermore, sir highlighted how supervisors train student's attitude towards critical investigation while simultaneously encouraging the student's creativity as well. Talking about how to deal with several problems that occur during research, Dr. Sharma explained the importance of weekly meetings and rescue plan if needed. Sir introduced the students to research ethics and emphasized upon the importance of intellectual honesty, advising the students to avoid plagiarism. Lastly, sir explained the importance of a well written report of the research that does not misinterpret any information and provided information to the students about the funding of research projects and how it furnishes benefits to them.
