Village development Projects:

Kishinchand Chellaram college has adopted Karwale village, Taluka and District Palghar since 2004, following is the brief information about the activities conducted in Karwale as well as in neighbouring villages Ghatim , Kandarvan and Navghar adopted under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan Scheme of Ministry of Education .

- **Fruit Tree Plantation:**

July 2021 was a lockdown period , some of our second year NSS volunteers planted trees in their residential area or at native place depending upon the availability of space and quality fruit tree saplings. After the release of lockdown to some extent the fruit tree plantation was conducted on 10th & 17th October 2021 . The fruit tree saplings included coconut tree, Alphanso and mango saplings, Chikku, Guava, Jackfruit and Jam. Total 310 saplings were planted by 100 NSS volunteers.



Swachha Bharat Abhiyaan

A.Cleanliness Drive:10th & 17th of October 2021

KCNSS's motto is "Not me, but you," and they have never failed to demonstrate their dedication and teamwork for the welfare of the environment and the people. On the 10th & 17th of October. The cleaning activity was conducted at following locations:

Cleaning and painting the well area at Waluntale and Bhogadi Pada respectively.

Cleaning of Anganwadi area near Walutale.

Cleaning of water stream near Walutale.

Operation and monitoring of Vermicomposting pits in Patil Pada area.

B.Toilet Constructions: March 2022

A group of 50 volunteers constructed three toilets during residential camp . One in Ranjanpada,Karwale and Two in the village Ghatim . The step to provide sanitary facilities to poor families. The total cost of durable asset was around 50,000/- that was provided by Kishinchand Chellaram College.

Swayam Siddha Project : Women empowerment

To make ladies from village self sufficient KC NSS unit has been making attempt in this direction for past 15 years , in the continuation of the project in this academic year following activities were conducted.

A. Pickle and Papad Making project

1. The first attempt was made in the month of May 2021 with a group of self aid group of Patilpada. 10 kg mango pickle was made by the group under the guidance of Dr. Satish Kolte. The products were sold in the College , Teachers and NSS volunteers were the customers.
2. The second attempt was made in the month of March 2022 with the self aid group of Ranjan pada during the residential camp . A group of 10 ladies are actively continuing the project. Dr. Satish Kolte gave the training of making the pickles without using any commercial/ synthetic preservatives. Awala and Lemon pickles made by the group asr becoming popular among the products. Till today 10 kg products are sold. The required technology of packing is

provided to them by Principal Dr. Hemlata Bagla worth Rs.10,000/- for the sustainability of the project.

3. Enthusiastically the same self aid group has started making papads made up of rice. The product is in demand and hope to get a good response.

B. Turmeric Powder and Chilli Powder Making.

Swayam Siddha project was launched in 2017 by Principal Dr. Hemlata Bagla ,by inaugurating a small manufacturing unit for self aid group of Patil pada to make Turmeric, Chilli and Coriander seeds powder. In this academic year approximately 50 kg Turmeric and Chilli powder was manufactured and sold in the K C college premises. This is the sustainable activity of KC NSS unit with respect to Women empowerment.



C. Diya Painting Project:

As an initiative towards women empowerment, the KCNSS Unit volunteers helped the women of Saphale in designing and painting diyas during Diwali on 17th October. Among the 1507 raw diyas that were brought to college, 600 diyas and paints were transported to Saphale. The women of Saphale and our volunteers put up their best coordinated efforts, teamwork and selfless service to make the diya painting a great success. It was a fun-filled experience for the volunteers and the women working together on the diya painting project.



Awareness activities:

Street Plays is one of the tool for creating awareness in society . The awareness was conducted by performing street plays on following topic:

1. Voters Awareness.

On 26th November, the KCNSS Unit volunteers organized a street play to increase voting awareness amongst the individuals in Saphale. The enlightening performance put up by the volunteers was an eye opener for the villagers as they learnt about the electoral process, the registration process and voting. This performance encouraged the people who had not yet created a voter id and to do so, participate in the electoral process.

- **YGPT Pad distribution – 10th March, 2022**

The volunteers actively participated in distributing 400 pads in the vicinity of Aarey Colony in Goregaon. - **THREE DAY WORKSHOP FOR SOCIAL MEDIA TEAM OF NSS VOLUNTEERS**

December 20, 2021

Bahai Campus, Panchgani

A team of 40 NSS Volunteers from universities all over Maharashtra gathered at the Bahai Campus, Panchgani on the 16th of December, 2021 for a 3-day workshop on Social Media Training organized by NSS Maharashtra and UNICEF. Accommodations were provided to all the volunteers for the same.

DAY 1

The workshop begins with a warming welcome speech by Dr. Prabhakar Desai, the volunteers were then addressed by Mr. Tanhaji Patil and Mr. Leson Azad which was followed by the lightning of the lamp.

The resource person for day 1 was Mr. Yogesh Borate, Professor at Savitribai Phule University, Pune with a history of working in the Media Production Industry.

Someone once said, “The strength of your social media is determined by the strength of your content”, This is exactly what we were taught that day. The session commenced with the question “what exactly is a story?” and then later covered different aspects of content writing, report writing, news writing, and creativity which included various fun individual as well as group activities along the line which was followed by a question-and-answer session.

DAY 2

The session began at sharp 9.30 am with the introduction of our resource person of the day, Mr. Akshay Upadhyay, Head of Department of Digital Media, MIT University, Pune. He explained the Importance of Visuals for social media platforms & threw light on the concepts like Web 1.0, Web 2.0, and explained the difference between them. The volunteers were then taught the 10 basic elements of Canva and were later asked to make posts for various social media accounts using these elements on a topic of their choice. The process of making an account on wordpress.com and uploading blogs of their own was also taught. With this, the session came to an end at 06:00 pm sharp.

DAY 3

To brief us on Audio-visuals and to conclude the 3-day workshop, Mr. Vaibhav Thakarey, HOD of Department of Mass Media communication from Vishwakarma University, Pune was our resource person. Here, the volunteers learned the importance of ideation and script. Necessities for Mobile content creation were explained and different types of shots that are to be taken while clicking or recording pictures of videos were taught respectively. Volunteers were then divided into groups of 5-7 members and were asked to create a 2-3 min video on the topic “Experience of the 3-day workshop at Bahai Campus”. By recollecting everything taught in the past 2 days all the groups portrayed their experience of the camp through their video. During the workshop, the volunteers were given a training kit.

On the final day of the three-day workshop, volunteers were tagged as the first team of NSS Social Media Warriors. Day 1: All the volunteers reached the camp safely, teaching staff at K.C. College, accompanied the volunteers on this day. NSS Director Dr. Satish Kolte and campsite owner Mr. Gajanan Patil formally opened the camp in the presence of all volunteers and a few villagers.





Day 2: three groups went to their "Shramdaan" work sites. The Shramdaan activity was centered on the construction of three toilets, two of which were located in Ghatim and one in Valutale. The raw materials were 10kgs of turmeric and 10kgs of Bedgi Mirchi. During this 7-day period, the project was continued.

Day 3: A group of volunteers assisted the ladies at Ranjanpada for the Pickle Making workshop once more. Everyone gathered at the campsite for tea before heading to Valutale and Bogadipada for street plays, where Group 3 performed 'Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav' and Group 4 performed 'Education Awareness.' All of the volunteers returned to the campsite for an update meeting, which was followed by dinner.

Day 4: After breakfast, volunteers went to their three toilet construction sites; the work that needed to be done that day was laying the foundation for the toilet cabin. A group of volunteers taught children how to use Microsoft Word at Ranjapada, and the same group also assisted in levelling the school grounds. Various activities were arranged by the volunteers.

Day 5: Volunteers continued the work of building the toilet which had to be completed by today. A group of volunteers went to Karvelpada and conducted sports activities for children as well as served refreshments to them. The Swayam Siddha project was continued at Patilpada, where turmeric packing and chili grinding had begun. The volunteers prepared the street play for the children's.

Day 6: Volunteers assigned to the toilet construction project began painting the toilets at all three sites, which were completed before lunch. The Cultural Program & price distribution, Patilpada Anganwadi in Karwale hosted the event. Around 90 villagers attended the program, which began at 7:30 p.m. Our volunteers performed various art forms such as

singing, dancing, and street plays, and the cultural program's theme was Azadi Ka Amrut

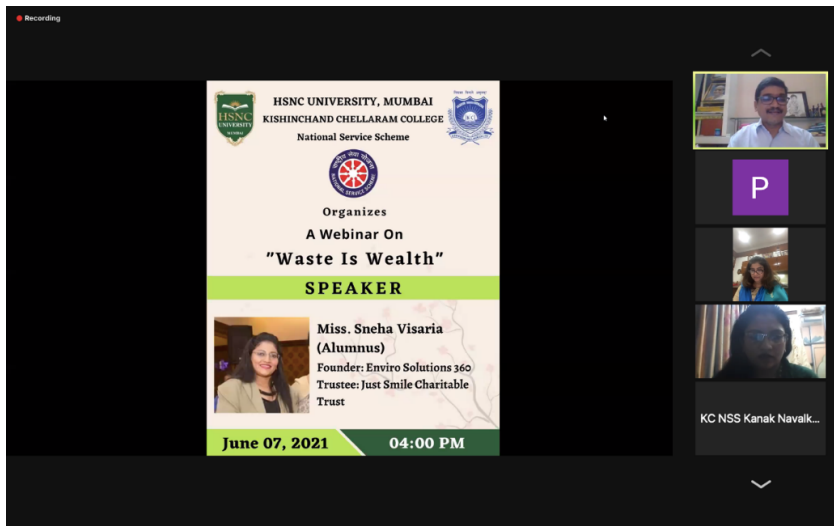


***Shivswaraya Din Sohala-**

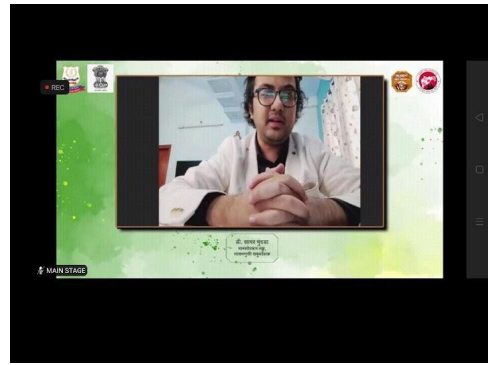
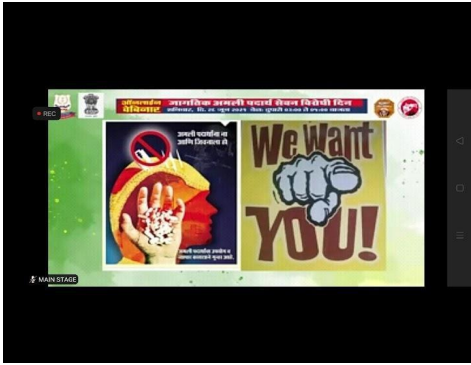
***Waste is wealth-**

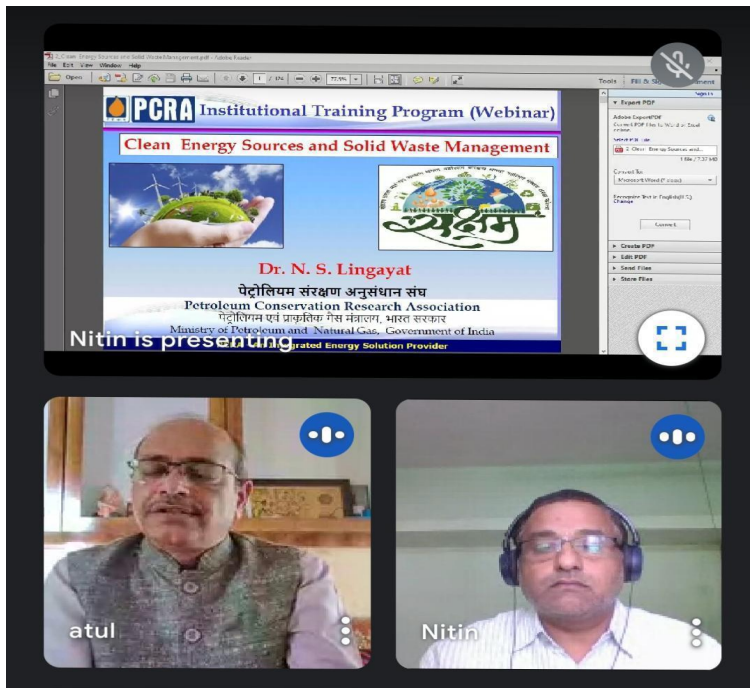
***Black Fungus Awareness-**

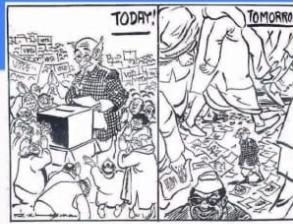

***National Youth Festival-**

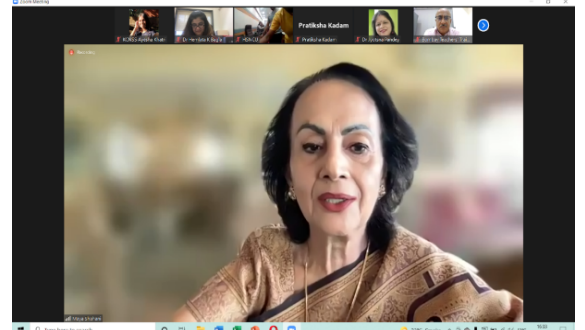
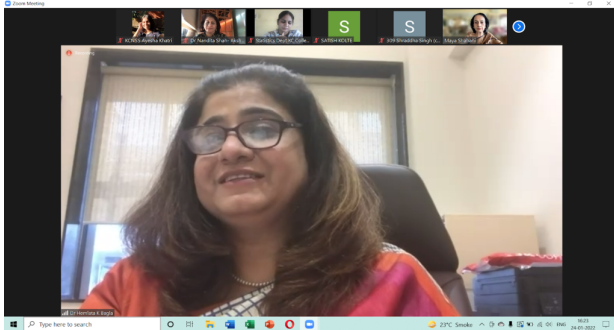

Disaster preparedness

- **-An Aid to the Flood struck Chiplun**

The NSS unit of KC College never fails to comfort and improve the situation of the community in a disaster, whether it was the 2005 Mumbai Flood or 2019 Kolhapur -Sangli Flood; and hence this year too in the crisis of Mahad- Chiplun Flood. KC NSS unit decided to participate in Flood Relief activity for Mahad-Chiplun Area and started collecting the necessary material from 29th of August. 20 volunteers worked hard day and night to target at least 100 families with the basic necessities and food grains.

Donation for essential commodities for Flood Collection drive was set up in KC College Campus. An appeal was made to join hands to make this activity successful to teachers, non-teaching staff and our well-wishers, who came forward with open hearts and contributed. Even when the world is still recovering from the aftermath of COVID-19, it's rightly said humanity never dies. As soon as the news about this catastrophe broke, citizens provided substantial aid. This aid coming from citizens were akin to rays of hope for the houses of chiplun which were stuck with darkness.

Under the guidance of Principal Dr Hemlata Bagla volunteers decided to make a kit which contained food grains and necessary commodities for at least 100 families which would suffice for at least two weeks. Volunteers worked hard in this direction and finally we packed bags which contained (Each sack consisted of : **5kg Rice, 4kg Wheat Flour, 1kg Dal, 2kg Sugar, 1kg Salt, 250g Tea Powder, 200g Turmeric Powder, 200g Chili Powder, 100g Mustard, 500g Brown Chana, 1 Matchbox, 1Pkt Upma, and due to packaging reasons, 1L Sunflower Oil, 3L Water, 200ml Milk was distributed separately**) Principal Madam added more significance by adding **utensil boxes** and **mats** to each of these kits. Hearty donations were made in the form of clothes for kids and adults, bedsheets, pillow covers, etc which were collected and distributed in the affected areas.

Volunteers aimed to lend a helping hand to at least 100 families severely affected. Upon receiving an overwhelming response from people, we surpassed our aim and received enough aid for atleast 110 families. Provost of HSNC University Mumbai Dr Niranjan Hiranandani along with Principal Dr Hemlata Bagla and Vice Principals appreciated volunteers for their noble contribution.

Following which a distribution plan was made for 8th August, 2021. A team of 13 volunteers of KC College, 3 non-teaching staff, Dr.Satish Kolte, director NSS HSNC University Mumbai departed to Chiplun for distribution. They also carried materials received from constituent colleges of HSNC University; HR College with donations for 102 families and BTTC College with donations for 20 families. The enthusiastic team reached out to 250 families with the help of local supporters and NSS program officer of D.B.J. College Chiplun, visiting 5 different locations namely: Baagwadi, Ganeshwadi, Nalawadewadi, Khandatboiwadi and Morowanefhata.

The situation of the villagers were catastrophic but the courage of the villagers to stand on their feet motivated Volunteers. All the debris were cleaned and life was continued on yet different signs of devastation was witnessed by volunteers, like the collection of mud in paddy fields which destroyed the cultivation and brought darkness for coming years for farmers, Our contribution was not sufficient to start their new life but it was definitely remarkable to understand the situation and take a step ahead to help in such a situation. This lesson was learned by young volunteers under the guidance of Dr.Hemlata Bagla and teachers and well-wishers to support directly and indirectly to make this act successful, we

don't wish for such a catastrophe to strike again but we NSS volunteers stands with our motto

“Not Me But You” and will make attempts to help in future.

Chellaram Trust donated supplies for 40 families, motivating volunteers to push on.

Principal Dr Hemlata Bagla donated 100 units of the full-size mat and a complete set of utensils, her donation provoked everyone in college and our donation drive was revamped.

By the end of the collection drive, KC NSS Unit could collect the basic needs of the total 110 Families.

All the three colleges of HSNC University i.e. HR College with donations for 102 families, BTTC College with donations for 20 families and KC College with donations for 110 families came up front and paved a better way for people in affected areas. From KC College a Truck and a travellers bus of 17 passengers was off to Chiplun including 3 Non - Teaching Staff: name name name, NSS Director Dr Satish Kolte and 13 NSS Volunteers. In Chiplun we had 7 hotspots of village where the donation drive took place namely: Baagwadi, Ganeshwadi, Nalawadewadi, Khandatboiwadi, etc. People in affected area were overwhelmed and eyes were filled with happiness.

- **Disaster Management Workshop**

28th and 29th March, 2022.

On 28th and 29th March 2022, a Disaster Management Seminar was conducted organized by NSS unit. The workshop was conducted by the staff of MCGM, nss volunteers, students, teaching and non teaching staff attended the seminar.

Day 1 (28th March 2022)

The seminar started at 10 am. The speakers for the 1st day were Mr. Rajendra Lokhande and Mr. D. M. Patil. Mr. Rajendra Lokhande, SI, Disaster Management Dept. MCGM conducted the first half of seminar wherein he enlightened the students on what is disaster, types of man-made and natural disasters, the golden hour, and the BMC disaster helpline. The topics of discussion under the natural disasters were on earthquakes, floods, cyclone, fire, etc. And the 10 methods of tackling disaster. He explained thoroughly ‘what to do’ and ‘what not to do’ while giving examples and sharing their own experiences. The lunch break was from

1.30 pm to 2.30 pm. The post-lunch session resumed by 2.30 pm and the session was continued by Mr. D. M. Patil, from fire brigade department. An interactive session was conducted by him wherein he briefed the students about the general principles of combustion, methods of extinction, types of fire and their demonstration. He also spoke about fire extinguisher including the methods of fire extinction, categories of fire extinguishers i.e. Type A, Type B & C and the ABC Type which makes use of mono ammonium phosphate and nitrogen.



Day 2 (29th March 2022)

The second day of the workshop started at 10.00 am by Mr Pravin Bramhadande, Disaster Management Dept MCGM. He informed the students about the Principles of first aid, contents, types of injuries and their signs, symptoms and treatment. He also explained why and how C.P.R is given. Lunch break was provided to the students at 1.30 pm. The post lunch session started at 2.30 pm and was continued by Mr. Pravin Brahmadande. It was a practical session wherein he showed us how to make improvised stretchers with the help of ropes, belts and blankets. These stretchers are helpful in carrying the casualty from the disaster site to the assembly point which would help to treat the injured and save a life. He also taught the students different types of knots like rift knot, thumb knot, thief knot, multiple thumb knots and clove hitch which can be useful in saving a life during a disaster. He showed various techniques for lifting a casualty in conscious and unconscious condition. The seminar ended at 5.00 pm by a vote of thanks by the one of the volunteer of NSS unit and the program officer by giving a token of appreciation to the speakers followed by national anthem.

Name: Bi-Valent Vaccine

Kept at 2-8 C

Marker made from fruit juice, used on the left hand Pinky finger. If not, do the same on leg.The volunteers were divided in 15 groups each group consisting of 3 to 4 volunteers.

'Suryakant Wagal Maternity Hospital' appointed a few members for the event. We started our pulse polio vaccination drive from morning 8' am to evening 5' pm. We were successful in providing the vaccines to most of childrens.

- **Food distribution camp**

NSS unit of Kishinchand Chellaram College in collaboration with Youth Global Peace and Transformation (YGPT), had conducted a food distribution activity on 9th November, 2021 at Aarey Colony, Goregaon. YGPT is a youth initiative with the vision of empowering today's youth to create and establish one happy global family. It organizes various distribution drives, such as food distribution, sanitary napkins distribution and distribution of many other things. Our college has collaborated with YGPT several times and till now we have been doing food and sanitary napkins distribution activity. This time we had a food distribution activity which included distribution of 100 packets of Dal and Rice which were brought by YGPT. With around 6-7 volunteers we went to Aarey Colony which is located near Mithi river where these activities took place. We then distributed 100 packets of dal and rice among the villagers. We deeply appreciate the effort, time and compassion behind this entire activity. This initiative was indeed a great opportunity for the NSS volunteers to do something for our community.

- **Voter ID registration campaign.**

Holding on to the importance of citizen participation in the electoral process so as to ensure a democratically chosen government, K.C College under its NSS Unit came forward with a voter id registration campaign for people. Mr.Raj and Ms.Ruchi from PCGT visited the college to instruct the registration process to volunteers so as to conduct them further. The team planned some activities for the campaign such as creating posters, a street play leading to voter registration for everybody. Out of all the posters that the NSS students made, nineteen were selected out of which sixteen were digital. These appealing posters pointed to voting as a need of the hour. One of them quoted- "The power to change your future, at the tip of your finger, VOTE." These were put up throughout the voter id registration camp which was successfully run at the college on 24th and 25th of November. On 26th, the NSS unit paid a visit to their adopted villages at Saphale with a team of around thirty volunteers. After reaching, they performed an informative street play focussing upon casting vote. There were about ten volunteers in the play characterized as people with different approaches during the elections. This prompted the villagers to understand the effect of each vote on the country. In the play, by performing relatable experiences of common people during elections; for instance- the pledges and promises that every political party took every year but never got implemented was the highlight to explain the 'None of the above'(NOTA) option in case of disapproval with all candidates. This proved to be an eye opening experience for the villagers. It also included how many people see election day as a holiday and go out. These instances connected the dots and conveyed the message at the end briefly, which was to use their right to vote, righteously. The play was performed four times distinctly at Patlipada, Ranjhanpada and Ghatim to aim at a maximum number of better informed audiences, eventually. Followed by, the registration camp was held which brought six people to apply for voter's id. Summing up, the College carried out sixty two registrations inclusively and most of them were around eighteen year old students. At last, It turned out to be an insightful campaign for KCNSS.
