H-CET - HSNCU COMMON ENTERANCE TEST GUIDELINES

1. **H-CET** Entrance exam is the qualifying examination for admission to the 2 Years MBA, MAEMA and 3 & 4-years BBA/ BMS / BCA Programmes offered under HSNC University, Mumbai

H-CET- 1: For MBA

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1.1 Eligibility for MBA/ MAEMA:

Graduates/postgraduates with Bachelor's / Postgraduate degree with at least 50% (for General Category) and 45% for Reserved and Physically / Differently abled candidates in any discipline (e.g. Engineering-Technology, Science, Commerce, Management, Accounts, etc.) from any university recognized by UGC/ AICTE / AIU or equivalent are eligible to apply. The percentages may be relaxed for the candidates from the Armed Forces or their children. However, there is no age limit to apply.

Fresh Graduates/postgraduates awaiting final result declaration can also apply and appear for **HCET**. The qualified and shortlisted candidates will be provisionally admitted.

1.2 Eligibility for BBA/ BMS / BCA:

- Passed 10+2 (HSC) or its equivalent examination (As per AICTE APH 2024-2027)
- Candidate appearing for 10+2 (HSC) or its equivalent examination are also eligible to appear for **H-CET**

2. Selection Criteria:

CAT, XAT, GMAT, C- MAT, MAT, SNAP, MH-CET or any State CETs scores may be considered. The aforesaid scores should be current and valid.

Candidates not having any of the above scores will be required to appear for HCET. In case of multiple test scores, a candidate can submit his or her best score. Candidates can also appear for **H-CET** for improvement of their Test Score. HSNCU will prepare a scale for comparison of Test Scores conducted by various agencies mentioned above. Such details will be placed on the admission brochures, material and HSNCU website in a fair and transparent manner.

Appropriate weightage will be given to various selection criteria including: scrutiny of application forms, test scores, group discussion, written essay and personal interview.

4. Qualifying Criteria:

Candidates securing more than the cut-off percentage (to be announced) in the entrance test will be declared as successful and eligible for the further admission process.

5. Validity Period:

The results of the Entrance Test will be valid for that one academic year only and the candidate must apply within this period for admission.

6. Unfair Means:

Candidates are advised in their own interest that they should not involve in any malpractice during H-CET Examination.

Candidate found using any unfair means will be debarred from Examination and the candidature will be suspended.

Once the registration is done, the H-CET online exam will be assigned to the candidates via mail.

7. Instructions for Online Examination: -

- a) Personal Laptop or Desktop computer or Smartphone in working condition with good quality camera. In case your desktop does not have a camera, use USB camera.
- b) Browser: Latest version of Google Chrome.
- c) Internet speed should be preferably minimum 1 MBPs for better results.
- d) Mobile Phone user must disable all notification such as WhatsApp, SMS, email before the commencement of examination.
- e) You may not be able to appear for the exam if web camera attached to your system is not functional.
- f) Use of headphones and phone calls is not permissible during the exam.
- g) Breaks are not allowed during the examination. The examination session is auto/image proctored and every physical movement of students or disruption in examination login is recorded and will be considered for doubtful activity. For five or more such activity the report of such students will be forwarded to unfair means committee of University/College.
- h) You are required to turn Off all your notifications and pop up for successful completion of the paper. In the event you receive TEN notifications your examination will be automatically terminated.
- i) As you are not allowed to deviate from your seat, keep all necessary items like roughsheets, simple calculator and pen with you.
- j) If your computer is not responding or there is a cut of power supply during the exam you need to re-log with your login credentials, all attempted questions will be saved in the database only if you click "SAVE" button. and you can resume from where you left the exam.
- k) Do not use the alt-tab, mouse or any other device to shift from examination screen to any

other screen while attempting the objective examination.

- l)** Ensure that your face has been visible throughout the examination otherwise it will be considered as misconduct and will be reported to the university. In the event of non-receipt of a webcam, your examination will be considered as null and void. Your exam activity will be monitored by the proctor and your exam will get terminated if you try any unfair practice.
- m)** The non-observance of the said rules will amount to a case of malpractice and will be reported to the grievance committee for decision.
